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Dear Parent / Guardian

I hope you have had a good summer break. We are looking forward to welcoming all our students back to school in September. Most of the information contained in this letter was sent to you in July, but I am sending it again so that you have the information to hand, as well as a few updates.

Because of the current situation, we will be implementing some changes so that students and staff are as safe as possible and that everyone can be welcomed back, re-establish school routines and make good progress with their learning.

Our systems will ensure that all students have access to the full curriculum. As far as possible, students will only be in contact with their own year group. Students in Y7 and Y8 will be in a consistent class. Each year group will have a designated area of the site for social time. Movement around the school will be carefully regulated with hand and respiratory hygiene facilitated. The site will have enhanced cleaning and sanitising throughout the day.

We will have a staggered start to re-opening. We are putting the following arrangements in place:

Wednesday 2 nd September	Y7 students start school; Y12 registration
Thursday 3 rd September	Y8, Y9 and Y13 return to school
Friday 4 th September	Y10 and Y11 return to school
Monday 7 th September	Y12 return to school

This staggered start will allow all year groups to receive important information about how to keep themselves and others safe, and to get used to new routines.

Travel to school – students are advised to travel safely - walking or cycling if possible. Buses dedicated to carrying school students will advise parents of the arrangements they will be putting in place. Students are advised to wear a face covering on school buses as there are likely to be students from different year groups on the bus. Students travelling by public transport must wear a face covering. Any student arriving at school with a face covering will be advised to remove it safely and, if disposable, place it in the bins provided. According to current government guidance, it is not necessary for face coverings to be worn in school.

LEARNING FOR LIFE

Arrival and departure – on arrival at school, students will remain outside in their designated year group areas until 8.30am, except in cases of bad weather. Disembarking from buses will be supervised so that only one bus disembarks at any one time. The refectory will be open for breakfast and different areas of the refectory will be designated for different year groups.

At the end of the day, students will be dismissed and accompanied by staff to the school exits to ensure safe dispersal.

Each year group will have access to the library on different days at break and lunchtime. Y7 – Monday; Y8 – Tuesday; Y9 – Wednesday; Y10 – Thursday; Y11 – Friday. The Sixth Form have their own study area. Socially-distanced access to the library will be available before and after school.

There is new signage around the school making routes clear. Classrooms will be well-ventilated and doors will be propped open where possible. Students will sit in the safest possible arrangement in each room. This will usually be side by side and facing the front where this is possible. **Students should always carry their own small bottle of hand sanitiser.** In addition, sanitising dispensers will be

available and students will be expected to sanitise their hands on entry to the classroom. Additional washing stations have also been installed around the school.

- Expectations of behaviour it is vitally important that our students maintain high standards of behaviour and follow our direction. In addition to our usual expectations, all students need to have full regard to safety and hygiene. Our Behaviour for Learning Policy is on our website. A further addendum to that policy, with particular regard to our current circumstances, is available here. I am sure you will understand that unsafe behaviour, whatever the intention, cannot be tolerated and we would ask that parents ensure that their children understand the importance of the arrangements we are putting in place.
- **Expectations of uniform** on our return to school, our usual high expectations will apply for the wearing of school uniform. Please note that Summer Uniform will not apply in September.

- **Use of equipment and the management of the site** It is very important that all students bring their own equipment and have it with them every day. Please note that there are additions because of the current situation. For clarity, the expectation is as follows:
 - Black or blue pens, including spares
 - Pencils, including spares
 - Ruler
 - Glue stick
 - Alternative coloured pen
 - Highlighters
 - Calculator
 - Reading book
 - Notebook
 - Tissues
 - Small bottle of hand sanitiser for personal use
 - A water bottle for personal use it is recommended that this is pre-filled from home to avoid the need to use water dispensers in school
 - Any equipment allocated by the school for personal use each student Y7 to Y13 will be given a mini-whiteboard and whiteboard pen for use in class.

We want to avoid loaning equipment because of the issues associated with keeping everything sanitised. Students need to take responsibility for having their own equipment and keeping their hands clean.

There will be enhanced cleaning and sanitising throughout the school. Bins will be available in every classroom and around the school for the safe disposal of tissues. ("Catch It, Bin It, Kill It.")

- 9 **Extra-curricular activities** these will be individually risk assessed and further information made available. It is likely that a number of extra-curricular activities will not be able to take place at the beginning of the autumn term.
- 10 **Attendance** All students should attend school from the beginning of the autumn term; please see the information about our staggered start at the beginning of this letter. Normal statutory attendance applies from 1st September.

Students who have coronavirus symptoms (a new, continuous cough, high temperature, a change in their normal sense of taste or smell) should stay at home. Anyone developing these symptoms during the school day will be sent home.

11 Information for the Sixth Form

The Sixth Form area has been relocated to i-block. Mr Cooke and the Sixth Form Team have their offices on the middle floor of i-block. Rooms i52 and i53 have become a new and extensive Sixth Form Study Room. The Sixth Form Café is now where the Y11 Café used to be and has been re-furbished for Sixth Form use. Y12 official enrolment day is on Wednesday 2nd September at 8.45am. Students should follow the signs to the Sixth Form area. Students will be able to register formally and check their subject choices. Formal attire is required. (Sixth Form ties are available for purchase on the day.) Enrolment should last no longer than one hour and then new Y12 students are able to go home. Lessons begin on 7th September.

We hope that our extensive planning and these arrangements will mean that students feel safe and comfortable on their return to school.
